### **Time Management:**

- ✓ Say, for example, 80 Marks question papers for 3 hours, say 180 minutes (3x60).
- ✓ Reserve 20 minutes for revision after writing the examination. 180 minus 20= 160 minutes
- ✓ One Mark question to be answered in 2 minutes (160/80)
- ✓ Two Marks question to be answered in 4 minutes (2x2)
- ✓ Three Marks question to be answered in 6 minutes (3x2) and so

### **Presentation of answers**

- ❖ The examination system, by and large, attempts to test what you know only through what you present on the paper. Therefore, you must know how to present and impress the examiner with a systematic and coherent way of writing the answers. Write what you know clearly and in an unambiguous manner.
- ❖ While knowledge, understanding, and memory play a very crucial role, presentation skills are the most significant deciding factor in the exam.
- ❖ You must finish writing the answers a little earlier than the time allotted so that you will have some time for revision and correction, if needed. In the last few minutes, when you go through the answers in a relaxed mood, you may remember the forgotten points or answers in a flash.
- ❖ Write all the multiple-choice questions (MCQ) together. Try to write the known answers as fast as possible and save time for other answers to think, recollect, and write.
- ❖ You should know and restrict the word limit of VSA/SA/LA-type questions. Otherwise, you may tend to write too much for VSA and very little for LA-type questions.
- ❖ Draw diagrams neatly with a pencil and label them properly. Do not draw diagrams in ink at all.
- ❖ Wherever required, show the steps, especially while deriving or solving numerical problems, because marks will be awarded for correct steps even though the final answer may be wrong.
